 agencies and other students. The University wants to add a clause to Policy 71 disallowing
 students from sharing course content with other students and external agencies. This could
 be harmful to students who are sharing content with other students and have good
 intentions. The goal of the change is to deal with external agencies and not to harm
 students.
- Q: What was the result with the policy amendment?
- A: part relating to external agencies passed onto senate for approval. Part relating to other students was tabled for reconsideration

- Q: Amending policies to reflect something in the Canadian criminal code may not be necessary
- A: The University not only wants to amend the policy, they also want notifications on course syllabus reminding students that all content is intellectual property of the professor
