6. Open Floor Discussion

- Q: Is there a detailed breakdown for sponsorship?
 - Yes, it was sent along with other council documents
- More details on math not liking us taking their courses?
 - Some options require 200 or 300 CS courses, need a 100 CS course as a prerequisite
 - The Math department requires you to have special permissions which can be a hassle and a half
 - Sometimes courses are not equivalent to engineering courses
 - Some course descriptions have 'Math/Science students only'
- Tron currently has an OS course as an anti-requisite for other CS operating systems courses but they don't overlap at all
- Next council meeting is in POETS!
- Q: Has the WaterlooWorks interface gotten better? No.
 - Can't go to job page from interview page \rightarrow that's bad
- Q: What happens if you give a course critique to the wrong professor?
 - We screen that
 - Contact Science and Computing. They are in charge of the system and might be able to let you edit things
 - Q: Why can we not edit our course critiques?
 - Pat will ask science and computing
 - Looking into changing the system to make it more anonymous
 - Maybe it is because they are trying to keep things anonymous, because now there is a link between you and that response
- Course evaluating system to evaluate your student advisor?
 - o Q: Most people don't interact with their advisor, so is this necessary?
 - This evaluating would still be optional
 - We should still have a way to only have the option to evaluate only if you've interacted with the student advisor

	calendar year according to Statistics Canada. This increase is subject to Ratification at the next Joint Annual General Meeting; and b. By a successful Joint Referendum specifying the amount the fee will be increased

8.2 Student Spaces Info and Opinions

Moved to after director updates.

Better Utilization of Space:

- Abdullah has been looking at student spaces to see where we can study more
- Mary Robinson submitted a WEEF proposal to get funding for instillation and for buying the things recommended in this presentation (we don't know our budget yet)
- Some spaces:
 - E2 Foyer, near concrete canoe :
 - 6-seater table with wheelchair accessibility space and outlets for where people can work and sit
 - Straw poll: mild
 - We can always move current couches to under FEDS board
 - Recommendation 2: replace the seating now with better couches, such as those in DC near the food court
 - They look weird but are good
 - Straw poll: 1 person

- Recommendation 3: to potentially do both, with the table on one side and have comfortable seating near FEDS board. We did a social experiment!
 - Similar straw poll results to 1
- Opinion: tables and chairs are good
- If someone is sitting at the table, might be awkward to sit with them
- Hopes for this space to be utilized in the evenings too

RCH/DWE Hallway:

- 1: Counter that goes a decent way down and have chairs, not necessarily stools, and have that go all the way down, with outlets
 - Approx. 20ft out of 60
 - \circ $\;$ The electrical part will be hard but it will need to be funded
 - If we do change it, we will need to consider lighting because it usually dark in there
 - Would not be valuable if the electrical can't happen
 - Might be kind of depressing to study in a hallway underground with no sunlight
 People are currently studying on that floor, this is key to Waterloo
 - Standing desk might be a good option in case electrical does not work out for temporary use
 - Leaning chairs would also be cool for temporary use for rest between classes

RCH 3rd Floor:

- Curved wall on the third floor
- We have space for some tables, these would not be blocking any study space
- Sometimes that is one of the most congested hallways on campus, that area is filled sometimes
 - We should take a look at how busy that specific spot is and how it would impede things
- Second option:
 - Counters with chairs
 - Less people would be able to sit in this space, but it also takes up less space over all
- Straw poll was half/half for both options

CPH 2nd and 3rd Floor:

- Put tables in there
- Straw poll: mild
- Whatever you implement, let's have a balance between group and independent study spaces
- Again, might be frightening to sit near four people
 - Some people have anxiety attacks
- Should have dedicated areas to group study and independent study
- Let's get sleeping pods
- Keep in mind: There are a lot of study spaces, including classrooms that are empty
- EngSoc should book classrooms and promote them more! Ex. E5 puts up posters for classrooms that are currently available
 - Portal has an app that does that

- More advertising of that would be helpful!
- Physical signs on classrooms are awesome!!! But we should still know when we are not supposed to be there
- Maybe put it on the lcd screens?
- Whiteboards are awesome would it be possible to have something similar to QNC?
 - Planning on setting something up in E2 foyer
- Some places turn off their lights so we can't study there, keep that in mind
- Buildings have been locked on the weekends which might be a new things → buildings should be open for classroom study space
 - There are some doors that are unlocked
- Message Abdullah if you have anything else to say
