#### 4.1 Feds Executive

Speaking: Deanna Priori (vpin@feds.ca)

- Student Life Endowment Fund is a \$100,000 + fund that you can apply to for improving student space, particularly for accessibility or safety improvements. Previously EngSoc has used it to get furniture for POETS. Applications are due February 26<sup>th</sup> at 11:59 pm
- FEDS Leadership Award. Nominations are due in early march. Check the website. It's a great way to celebrate student leaders. They get to go to a dinner with the associate deans of all the faculty's and other important people

#### 4.2 Feds Election Candidates

Speaking: Rachel Malevich (president.b@engsoc.uwaterloo.ca)

Team Gold:

- Antonio Brieva running for President, Andrew Clubine for VP Education, Jill Knight for VP Internal, and Brian Schwan VP Operations and Finance
- o Overall Motto is "Leadership that works for you"
- Work to bring value for fees, building support for communities on campus, and enabling success both academically and personally
- Andrew Clubine has a background in local advocacy, including negotiating the most recent UPass deal, provincial lobbying. He has also instigated a co-op fee review because CECA is not able to give a detailed breakdown of where the fee goes, and monitored the rollout of waterloo works. He has been working on some of these already as a student senator and governor and would continue as VP Education. Of note, for engineering co-op students you aren't covered under the employment standards act, he would advocate to the provincial government to change this. Also planning to work on student rights such as the housing problems with unfinished buildings and start a free drop in student legal rights advisory service
- Jill Knight is looking to do a governance reform in which she would look at the structure of council, and increase student engagement and feedback which looks different in all faculties. She wants to be present and visible within engineering and she has the time and resources to come to engineering in its home base, get to know the engineering students. Also planning to bring visibility to student run services such as MATES
- o Brian Schwan has been working on the budget this year and plans to do a full review of budget procedures if reelected. FEDS currently is transparent but not necessarily efficient. In addition, our current health and dental plan expires next year, he will conduct a review and put out a call for offers from different providers

#### Team Reboot

- Caleb Voskamp running for President, Heather Bone for VP Education, Andrew Zettel for VP Internal, and Joshua Voskamp for VP Operations and Finance
- They are aware that the relationship between FEDS and engineers is not ideal. They
  have already received lots of feedback from engineers in the vein of "screw feds".
   They want to work alongside student societies in a relationship that is entirely not
  business as usual
- Caleb would be working towards securing society presidents a voting seat on the FEDS council as they already represent a large community and it would make sense for them to represent their community within FEDS as well
- Heather will work with CECA to make co-op fees more transparent and advocate for the reintroduction of student tax credits which engineering benefits greatly from
- Andrew is aware that lots of FEDS activities in occur in the SLC or in arts buildings at impractical hours. He want to make events happen all over campus at hours that work for engineering students
- Joshua has noted that general spending has increased greatly and the FEDS fee is rising faster than inflation. He is promising budget cuts by restructuring the FEDS staff in order to get the FEDS fee reduced

- Year after year, FEDS has broken promises of accountability. If we don't meet our campaign promise of cutting fees, Caleb personally will give back salary proportional to the amount of the fee cut they cannot achieve
- Jazbel Wang (VP Internal)
  - Current MathSoc President
  - She is a final year CS student, who has been a part of the St. Jerome's and Math communities. She has been an orientation leader, MathFOC, MEF director, and has worked previously with Adelle and Rachel
  - She aims to make a more welcoming and inclusive atmosphere within FEDS, and will be promoting healthy involvement and enrichment
- Q: Some talk of restructuring feds council, given the current structure how do you plan to make them more accountable?
  - Reboot: Our plan to have society presidents be a voting member would help, as currently the president can sit on council but can't vote. It would strengthen society relations
  - Gold: We agree, societies need seats on council if they are going to accomplish things. Also, there's internal change that needs to happen culturally, through governance but also leadership from the top
- Q: I like the idea of having president sit on council, but we do have six councilor positions only half of which were filled. We always have lack of faith or interest, how will you fix this?
  - Reboot: One step is making sure FEDS is present in engineering spaces. It is also a cultural problem, for most of my undergrad, I didn't know what FEDS did for me.
     Every two weeks we will release a video on what's going on and what progress is being made to increase transparency
  - Gold: I don't think the problem is communication, I think it's a structural problem. For
    instance, the policy change on tax credits for co-op students happened without
    consulting engineering. Within engineering, 80% of students benefitted \$30 or less
    from this change, they need to be included in the conversation
  - O Jazbel: this is a problem with visibility and I can work on this as a VP Internal. As MathSoc president, I know that some of these things are hard to do. Students need to be proactive. MathSoc and EngSoc already have seats on senate and CECA, and report back to their constituents. FEDS has seats there too and we need to work with each other. Some of the change needs to come from students wanting to hear more. People have to work and be proactive and make an effort to sit in at meetings that matter.
- Q: Team Reboot is currently running on campaign to reduce feds fee. How will you achieve that?
  - All spending other than service salaries and general office will be rolled back to 2012 or 2013 spending levels. General office and service salaries will be restructured to last year's levels
- Q: What effect on will this have on student services?
  - There's really two sides to FEDS, the commercial side and the services side. Our proposed cuts are commercial, to make that more efficient. For instance FEDS Used Books could have reduced operating hours after first month of term

- Q: Team Reboot, if you can't meet the promised spending cuts, instead of salary cut will you get a goose tattoo on your butt?
  - Yes
